Vineyard Description:

This Zinfandel comes from three vineyards. The first, Timber Crest Vineyards, is located on the famed eastside bench of Dry Creek Valley. These 45 year old vines are the "old mother" clone planted on St. George rootstock. The second, Perotti Vineyard, is a West Dry Creek vineyard that yields 3 tons per year and adds a beautiful fruit forward aroma and distinctive acidity. Paulines Vineyard which is directly across from the winery. Owned and farmed by winery Partner Randy Peters, this vineyard is made up of the famous Cortina soil.

Winemaker Notes:

This classic Dry Creek Valley Zinfandel is rich and deeply structured. Weighing in at only 14.4 alcohol, this wine shows the elegance of the varietal. Fresh huckleberry and violet aromas with flavors of wild berry cobbler, a little black pepper, and a beautiful acidity show case this deep wine. Drink now through 2018 and don't be afraid to lay down for a couple of years.
